Quality of accreditation: why is there a programme for the recognition of accrediting agencies?

Accreditation systems may appear to be a valid method for the quality assurance of medical education, but the existence of an accreditation system does not provide a guarantee that the system is working well and resulting in trustworthy decisions on the quality of programmes in medical education.

Another challenge is to ensure the integrity of accrediting agencies in the evolving market for accreditation, where private firms and individual consultants offer their services in conducting a review and issuing an accreditation. In countries without a national accreditation system, it is tempting for an institution in higher education to pay for accreditation from a private firm or individual.

These problems in accreditation stress the need for a robust and independent system for the evaluation and recognition of accreditation agencies.
